BIOPSY CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- There are no activity restrictions following your biopsy. You may shower and swim as you normally would do.
- Leave the waterproof bandage in place while the wound is healing. If it falls off, cover the wound with either a new waterproof bandage or Vaseline/Aquaphor and a regular bandage. Do **not** apply OTC antibiotics ointments. The bandage may stay in place for several weeks, acting as a second layer of skin to protect the new skin growing underneath.
- Should bleeding occur, apply firm, constant pressure on the bandage for 15-20 minutes. This will usually stop minor bleeding. Once the bleeding has stopped, you may cover the wound with Vaseline/Aquaphor and a clean bandage.
- Infection: Infection seldom occurs when the wound care instructions have been carefully followed. Signs of infections for which you should call the office include increased pain, swelling, redness or yellowish drainage several days after the procedure.
